**Lori Moyer Brown** is the Director of Forensic Services at the Forensic Interview Center of the Oconee County Sheriff's Office in Watkinsville, Georgia. She serves as a forensic interviewer on the Crimes Against Children Unit, specializing in interviews of children with developmental disabilities and other special needs. Ms. Brown facilitates peer review of forensic interviewers for the Western, Piedmont, Northern, Forsyth and Mountain Judicial Circuits in Georgia. She also serves as an advisor for The Cottage Child Advocacy Center/Sexual Assault Center of Northeast Georgia. She lectures on topics including mandated reporter training, forensic interviews in computer-facilitated crime against children, forensic interviews of adults and children with developmental disabilities, and the process of disclosure. She serves as a panel member on the Georgia Department of Education's State Advisory Panel which advises the State Board of Education on issues which effect children with special needs. She also served on the Advisory Panel to the Georgia Governor's Working Group on Abuse in School Settlings. Ms. Brown is on the faculty of Child First/Finding Words Georgia which educates professionals on a protocol for forensic interviewing and previously served on the training team for the Georgia Fatality Investigative Team. She received her degree from the University of Georgia, majoring in psychology, with a minor in political science. She graduated with honors from the National Center of Paralegal Training and worked as a litigation paralegal for several years prior to concentrating on the special needs population and working with law enforcement. Ms. Brown is currently serving on Georgia's Criminal Justice Act Advisory Committee representing individuals with disabilities.
